Amending the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

WHEREAS, the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Department of Transportation requires all urbanized areas, as established by the U. S. Bureau of the Census, doing area-wide urban transportation planning that involves more than one Department of Transportation operating administration, to submit a Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization, in cooperation with the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), has prepared the Eastern Shore 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the following project has been approved for inclusion in the 2045 LRTP:

• Project Description: Installation of traffic signal at the intersection of US HWY 31 and Eastern Shore Blvd; Engineers Estimate:\$143,678.00

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Eastern Shore Metropolitan Planning Organization, has reviewed and approved the foregoing, does hereby adopt the listed project for inclusion in the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan.
